

Chamber Made Opera is committed to the creation and presentation of new performance works that investigate the intersection of music, performance and design. Over its 25 year history the company has built a reputation for creating era and artformdefining works and for bringing together outstanding creative teams to take on inspired artistic challenges. Synonymous with commissioning and presenting work at the very edge of contemporary practice the company has forged partnerships with: Melbourne Recital Centre, Castlemaine State Festival, Asia TOPA, Arts House, Arts Centre Melbourne, Punctum, Fed Square, Limerick City of Culture (IRE), In Between Time Festival (UK), RMIT University, Bell Shakespeare and La Mama. Chamber Made Opera receives multivear funding from the Victorian State Government (Creative Victoria) and City of Melbourne, and has an enduring base of support from other funding bodies, philanthropic trusts, earned income and private donations. ARTISTS' STATEMENT

In Chinese numerology the number 8 is representative of harmony and prosperity in life and the number 9 of achievement on a higher spiritual plane; this work explores the space between the two.

Between 8 and 9 sets into play a series of oscillations and revolutions: physical, aural, material, cultural, linguistic, virtual. At its core it is a listening experience where techniques, voices and musical instruments from Melbourne and Chengdu intertwine.

As an audience member you will find yourself seated at a table in one of eight groups of eight. One of the performers will be sitting with your group. In front of you, on the table, is a form based on a western mathematical concept of Fibonacci sequences or the Golden Mean, reflective on the shape of the unfolding music. Manipulated by the performers and the audience, its movement and shape, along with the chapters of music, evoke a reflection on musical and sonic concepts, as well as determining a series of movements in the manner of a dance score.

A selection of musical concepts are seen as found texts on the back of the coloured cards; they are linguistic analyses from traditional Chinese musical theory, created by Adrian Tien (2015).

At times immersive and others observational Between 8 and 9 is an unusual combination of sanctuary and ambition; a meditation on the concept of 和 (hé), ("harmonious, harmony") in the broader cultural sense, for example, the gatherings of people, and in the combination and juxtaposition of musical sound, and between materiality, and the spirit. Even where the people or the music may have many differences, a state of 和 is not only desirable, but achievable.

We are grateful to the whole collaborative team for bringing this work into form. We needed all of you, audience included.

艺术家声明

在中国数字学中,8代表着生活的和谐和繁荣,9 代表着在更高精神层次上取得成就;本作品探索 了两者之间的空间。

《八和九之间》在很多方面带来了颠覆和革命: 身体、听觉、材料、文化、语言、虚拟。作为一 种听觉体验,从根本上说,它融合了墨尔本和成 都的众多技巧、声音和乐器。

现场有八张桌子,每张八个座位,作为观众,您 会坐在其中一张桌子前。一名演员会与您所在组 坐在一起。在您眼前的桌子上,有一个基干西方 数学概念斐波那契数列(或黄金分割)的造型, 反映的是正在演奏的音乐的形式。在演员和观众 的操控下,演出的进展和形式与其乐章一起,不 仅以舞蹈乐谱的形式塑造了一系列动作,而且映 射出一些音乐和声学概念。

在彩色卡片的背面,可以发现关于一些精选出来 的音乐概念的文字;这些言语分析选自田映春 (2015)提出的中国传统音乐理论。
